Summary of my recommendations:

Asset Valuation

The School Room is valued at £301,000 on the Asset Register. Noted that this was professionally valued in 2022. Building costs have dramatically increased in the last two years. The Zurich valuation is £261,334. At renewal which is 1st May, request that the Buildings Sum insured is raised to £301,000. Hopefully this should not increase the premium, as Zurich must want to retain your business.

Financial Regulations

There is difficulty with obtaining quotes for small value items. Consider, at next review, amending the need to obtain 3 quotes for items over £1000.

“The Council will endeavour to obtain 3 quotations for items in excess of £1000.”

Policies and Procedures

Data Protection

The Information Commissioners Officer would recommend identifiable council specific e mail addresses to separate personal e mails from those sent in relation to council work. The Clerk has a council specific e mail address, and the need to have similar for councilors could be seen as unnecessary in a small council like WPC. None the less when the Data Protection Policy is reviewed, it would be a good time to revisit the seven principles of data protection. Induction training for new councilors includes training on Data Protection and new councilors should be encouraged to attend this training. Data Protection is a Risk identified on the Council's Risk Management Policy and training should be added as a way of minimizing risk.

FOI Publication Scheme

At next review update the Scheme. e.g. Class 2 Annual Return is now AGAR Class 5
Dark Skies Policy included in list of Council's own documents.

Grant Awarding Policy

Consider adopting a Grant Awarding Policy and application form. This would promote transparency and help with Council decision making.
